**Minutes of State Co-ordination Committee, Haryana
(Held on 23.12.2025)**

Subject: Minutes of Meeting of the State Co-ordination Committee of Haryana comprising of GST Authorities from the Central & State Tax Administration held on 23.12.2025 through Hybrid Mode- reg.

The meeting of the State Co-ordination Committee of Haryana comprising of GST Authorities from the Central & State Tax Administration, chaired jointly by Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner, CGST & CE Zone Panchkula and Sh. Vinay Pratap Singh, Excise & Taxation Commissioner, Haryana, was held on 23.12.2025 through hybrid mode. The following officers were present during the meeting:

2. At the outset, Smt. Rachana Singh, Additional Commissioner, CCO, CGST Panchkula Zone felicitated the Chief Commissioner, CGST Panchkula Zone and Excise & Taxation Commissioner, State GST Haryana and welcomed all the officers who were

present in the meeting. She invited Chief Commissioner CGST Panchkula Zone to address the members.

3. Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner welcomed Excise & Taxation Commissioner, State GST Haryana and all the officers present in the meeting.

4. Thereafter, Smt. Rachana Singh, Additional Commissioner started with the issues discussed in the previous meeting. The points raised/action suggested in the minutes of the last meeting were taken up one by one as listed below:

S. No.	Issues	Action Taken
1.	Whether State GST has cancelled GST registration of M/s BMS Metal or not?	Sh. Nitin Anand, Principal Commissioner, CGST Rohtak, informed that DETC Sirsa has already furnished a detailed reply to the Rohtak Commissionerate, confirming that all necessary investigation and verification have been carried out. As per the current position, the firm is operating as a manufacturer rather than a trader and is functioning on a sound footing. Accordingly, the State Government has not cancelled the registration. Further, Pr. Commissioner Rohtak informed that taxpayer has challenged the show-cause notice issued to them under Section 122 before the High Court and Hon'ble High Court has stayed the matter and directed that no final order be passed. In view of this stay, no further action can be taken on the show-cause notice at present.
2.	Whether the information/ data has been received in respect of District Health & Family Welfare Society, Narnaul (GSTIN: 06RTKDO3502C1D8) and District Food & Supply Controller, Narnaul (GSTIN: 06AAAGDO893D1ZS) from State GST Authorities?	Sh. Reyaz Ahmad, Commissioner, CGST Faridabad, informed that data for the unit District Health & Family Welfare Society has been received, however no data was received in respect of District Food & Supply Controller. In this regard it was further informed by Ms. Sofia Martin Joy, Commissioner, CGST Audit Gurugram that the unit has been surrendered to the DG Audit as it was non-responsive. Therefore, the

		matter need not be pursued with the State Government at this stage.
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5. Thereafter, Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner, drew attention of the members towards the issue of recovery of arrears in cases where the Central GST authorities have booked the case, but the taxpayer is registered under State GST, and vice versa. He requested the members to share their views on this matter, as discussion was initiated in the previous State Coordination meeting.

First of all Sh. Amish Kumar Gupta, Commissioner, CGST Panchkula, explained the current practice being followed in Panchkula Commissionerate. He informed that recovery is carried out by the formation that initiates the action. Adjudication and issuance of show-cause notices are handled by the formation that conducts the investigation. He also referred to the Board's letter issued in this regard in 2018.

Sh. Vinay Pratap Singh, Excise & Taxation Commissioner, Haryana, agreed with the view that the authority which initiates the case should handle recovery, regardless of the taxpayer's registration. He stated that as per his knowledge the guideline are being followed, however he will check with his field offices if there are any deviations.

Sh. Nitin Anand, Pr. Commissioner, CGST Rohtak, confirmed that CGST Rohatk also follows the same approach in respect of such cases. Further, he informed that there were 1-2 aberrations where CGST Rohtak forwarded cases to SGST for recovery, but State Authorities returned these cases. He was of the view that as instructions are clear on the issue, both departments should follow the same.

Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner asked about the practices being followed in cases booked by DGGI. Sh. Nitin Anand, Pr. Commr. responded that in case of Show Cause Notices issued by DGGI are answerable to Jurisdictional authorities. In cases where multiple noticees are involved, SCN is adjudicated by Common Adjudicating Authority and recovery is done by jurisdictional Commissionerates.

Sh. Reyaz Ahmad, Commissioner, CGST Faridabad, expressed the view that recovery should be done by jurisdictional authorities as the power to suspend registrations is with jurisdictional authorities only.

Sh. Sanjiv Gautam, Pr. Commissioner, CGST Gurugram, was also of the view that ideally, after adjudication, recovery should be handled by the formation where the taxpayer is registered. He further informed that as far as he is aware, this is the practise followed in his commissionerate. He also noted that CGST Gurugram tracks all confirmed demands regardless of the fact that which authority has booked the case.

Thereafter, Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner, requested all Commissionerates to submit details of the practices followed in their respective offices along with their views on this matter. He added that the issue will be examined and if necessary, the difficulties faced in implementing the instruction will be flagged to the Board for further guidance.

6. Thereafter, Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner drew attention towards the preparation of infrastructure for setting up of GSTAT Benches and sought the updated status from CGST Rohtak and CGST Gurugram.

Sh. Anoop Kumar Verma, Additional commissioner, CGST Rohtak informed that the Assistant Registrar visited the office for temporarily setting up the office of GSTAT at GST Bhawan, Rohtak. When the Chief Commissioner inquired about the facilities, he informed about the availability of 2 rooms, halls, furniture, and internet connectivity. It was further informed that online hearings will commence in January, once the IT infrastructure/computers are received. Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner instructed them to float new tenders for hiring a building at Hissar. He further informed that DoR is of the view that Doordarshan Kendra proposal is taking too much time to materialise, therefore fresh tenders should be floated.

Thereafter, Sh. Sanjiv Gautam, Pr. Commissioner, CGST Gurugram, raised the matter of obtaining approval from the State GST Authority for a 2,500 sq. ft. area for the GSTAT bench in Gurugram. He further noted that GDPL had also raised the same issue.

Sh. Vinay Partap Singh, Excise and Taxation Commissioner responded that matter is under consideration and positive outcome is expected within fifteen days. As regard the preparation for work on 4,500 sq. ft. area, Pr. Commissioner, CGST Gurugram informed that final design will be sent to principal bench for approval. He further informed that GSTAT is expected to be functional by 31st January.

7. After conclusion of discussion regarding the infrastructure for setting up of GSTAT Benches, Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner asked if the members have any other issue to discuss. Smt Rachana Singh, Additional Commissioner asked if the representative from DGGI have any issue to raise to which Sh. Hardeep Singh, DD, DGGI replied that there is no issue.

8. Sh. Reyaz Ahmad, Commissioner, CGST Faridabad, responded by raising the point of setting up a mechanism for monitoring of various alerts received by Commissionerates. He stated that when they receive alerts from DGARM they transfer the same to State GST Authorities if the taxpayer is registered with State. Similarly State GST has there TRU unit which is entrusted with the task of issuing alerts and State Divisions send the alerts to respective commissionerate if the same pertain to Centre. He suggested that nodal officers should be appointed in Centre as well as State offices to whom these alerts can be sent. This will streamline the process and authorities will know whom to approach if coordination is required.

He emphasised that this approach would enable centralized tracking and ensure proper accountability for actions taken on alerts.

Sh. Vinay Partap Singh, Excise and Taxation Commissioner agreed to the proposal and stated that Joint Commissioner of Rohtak, Faridabad, Hisar, Gurugram and Panchkula Ranges will be nominated for this purpose. Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner, nominated Additional/Joint Commissioners, Anti-Evasion for the CGST formations.

9. As there was no other issue to be discussed, Smt. Rachana Singh, Additional

Commissioner, CCO, CGST Panchkula Zone concluded the meeting by giving a vote of thanks to Sh. Naveen Kumar Jain, Chief Commissioner and Sh. Vinay Pratap Singh, Excise & Taxation Commissioner, State GST Haryana and other members for participating actively in the discussion and suggesting ways to handle the issues in coordination with each other.
